
Good Grief - Be Brief!

- Have a specific message: "I object to..." i.e. the Health Insurance Exchanges; implementing the provisions of ObamaCare; collection of personal biometrics, etc.
- Include excerpt and page # from the actual bill
- Use your own words
- When sending e-mails sign your name, include home address and phone #

2011 OK Session Passed 385 Bills into Law



Repeal existing law

HB 2130 by Steele 2011

Amend

Changes a current section of Oklahoma law

Amendments are indicated by strike-thrus and underlines

Read the strike-thrus and underlined sections

- SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 128, O.S.L. 2009 (36 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 4602), is amended to read as follows:
- Section 4602. A. The Insurance Commissioner in collaboration with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Health Care for the Uninsured Board (HUB) Executive Director shall advise and aid the Health Care for the Uninsured Board (HUB) in its duties.

 The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall be the Executive Director. The Insurance Commissioner Executive Director is hereby authorized to promulgate such reasonable rules as are necessary to implement the purposes of this act.
 - 1. The Health Care for the Uninsured Board shall consist of:

 a.two members to be appointed by the Governor who shall represent the interests of the top five health insurance providers in the state,
 - b.one member to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate who shall represent the interests of insurance agents in the state,
 - c.one member to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives who shall represent the interests of
 Oklahoma employers,
 - <u>d.the Chief Executive Officer of the Oklahoma Health Care</u> <u>Authority, or designee,</u>
 - e.the Insurance Commissioner, or designee, andf.an actuary, to be designated by the Oklahoma State
 - Employees Benefits Council.
 - 2. Appointees shall represent interests affected by insurance exchange requirements, including business interests, consumers and insurance providers

SENATE BILL 411 By: Brown

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7300 of Title 36, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- A. The Insurance Department shall, in collaboration with the State Department of Health, establish and maintain a comprehensive health care information system. The comprehensive health care information system shall be published on a website that permits consumers to see approximate pricing information on different health care services from different types of providers.
- B. The purpose of the comprehensive health care information system shall be to:
 - 1. Serve as a resource for insurers, employers, providers, purchasers of health care, and state agencies to continuously review health care utilization, expenditures, and performance; and
 - 2. Enhance the ability of consumers and employers to make informed and cost-effective health care choices.
- C. In presenting data from the comprehensive health care information system, comparative considerations shall be made regarding geography, demographics, general economic factors, and institutional size.

Supp. 2010, Sections 47 and 52), which relate to the Economic Development Generating Excellence Fund and the Economic Development Generating Excellence Fund Policy Board; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.


BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:




SECTION 1. REPEALER Section 2, Chapter 85, 2nd Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2006, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 350, O.S.L. 2007 (62 O.S. Supp. 2010, Section 52), is hereby repealed.

SECTION 1. This act shall become effective July 1, 2011.

- Learn how the legislative process works – then work the process
- Call, Meet, and Write to State Legislators (include voting address)
- If no response in 10 days, email legislator, requesting reply
- Make an appointment to meet him/her personally
- Inform yourself and others (Sunday school, work, etc. Recruit them.)
- Keep in touch read the information and alerts

- Avoid groups that do not include a link to the bill they're asking support for – something is wrong!
- Join/donate to grassroots groups
- Attend Action Meetings
- Make the calls when asked!
- Plan to visit the Capitol at least twice during the session; more if time permits
- Get involved in your precincts, and in the county and state party
